The future of your gift

How your legacy of love and light will bring Jesus' love to the outcast and forgotten.

At WorldShare, we believe every person has been created in God's image. We work to transform lives, particularly the lives of people who are outcast and forgotten, by loving like Jesus.

Generosity from supporters like you make it possible to focus on the areas of greatest need:



Orphans and vulnerable children

The youngest among us are often the most helpless. We are supporting extended families and local communities to meet the basic needs of orphans and vulnerable children by providing food, shelter, clothing, access to education and healthcare – including treatment of children living with HIV/AIDS.



Girls and women facing abuse and neglect

In many places, being female comes with extreme vulnerability and disadvantage. We are working to provide girls and women with education, vocational training, healthcare and livelihood opportunities to free them from the cycle of poverty.



Severe medical needs

Many of the world's most vulnerable people are in desperate need of medical care and they simply cannot afford it. We are working to reach the poorest communities with the healthcare and treatment they need for a healthy future.



Hearing impairment

We provide a safe haven for people with hearing impairment. Our Ministry Partners provide specialist services including medical care, access to education and the teaching of vocational skills to give these marginalised people a secure future.



Exploitation

Child labour is especially rife amongst poverty-stricken areas. We are working to protect children through access to education and healthcare, plus providing parents with alternative livelihoods free from exploitation.



Displaced groups facing ethnic exclusion

As a result of persecution and violent conflict, many groups of people have become systematically blocked from opportunities and resources they need to survive. We provide these marginalised communities with spiritual care, security, education, healthcare and economic livelihoods.



Spreading the gospel

All of our Ministry Partners are Christ-centred organisations looking to share the love of Jesus. We also work with our partners on evangelical programs. These include outreach events as well as training and funding for ministers, chaplains and church planters, so they can be better equipped to share both the love and message of Jesus Christ.

Annabel

Birth and rebirth at 14 years old

Annabel came to the Wakisa Centre after falling pregnant to her biological father at age 14. He had begun sexually abusing Annabel two years earlier when her mother fled to Sudan, leaving behind Annabel and her younger brother. Over those years her father repeatedly threatened to kill her if she told anyone but, according to Annabel, it was actually a more 'minor' threat of his – that she would never go back to school again – that kept her quiet all that time. ***“I loved school so much that I never told anyone.”***

When she fell pregnant at 14, Annabel was so innocent that she didn't realise what was going on in her body until her school's Headmistress noticed her body's changes and told her she was pregnant. When Annabel described what had been going on the

Headmistress reported it to the police and Annabel's father was arrested and jailed.

A few months after arriving at Wakisa, Annabel safely gave birth to a healthy baby boy.

While at the Wakisa Centre, Annabel received counselling and went through vocational training before deciding to go back and finish school. Also during this time, Annabel's life was changed by the love she experienced at Wakisa and, by the Grace of God, she converted from Islam to Christianity.

All of that was four years ago. Today she is in her final year of high school and she hopes to go to university and eventually become a lawyer to defend the rights of women and girls like her.

Important *things to know*

We encourage you to look after your loved ones first

It's a big decision to choose what you wish to happen in the future and, first and foremost, we want you to make sure that you've taken care of your loved ones in your Will.

After doing this, if you feel you might like to help future generations of vulnerable people living on the margins by contributing a gift in your Will, we would be so grateful.

Every bequest gift has an impact

No matter the size of your gift, remembering WorldShare in your Will can ensure our doors are always open to welcome people desperately seeking help. Smaller gifts are combined to fund our work well into the future and larger gifts can establish a new program, service or capital expense.

Your options for leaving a gift in your Will

There are three types of gifts you can choose from:

A residuary bequest – After taking care of friends and family, you can leave all or a percentage of the remainder of your estate to WorldShare.

A percentage of your estate – Leave a nominated portion or fixed percentage of your estate to WorldShare. This will remain inflation-proof and you'll be less likely to need to update your Will in the future.

A specific bequest – Leave a specific sum of money or a specified item, such as artwork, jewellery, property, antiques or shares, to WorldShare.



For your Solicitor

We have prepared some wording for your solicitor to use to include a gift to WorldShare in your Will:

I bequest to WorldShare (ABN: 16 001 441 103) for its general purpose the sum of \$..... (or portion of or residue of estate or description of property) and I declare that the receipt of the treasurer or other proper officer shall be sufficient discharge of my Trustee.

If you already have a Will and would like to add a gift to WorldShare, you can speak to your solicitor about adding a codicil – a short legal amendment.

Please remember – always seek advice from a solicitor or the public trustee in your state when creating or updating your Will.

Our promise to you

1. We appreciate that your Will is very personal to you. We will always respect your privacy and treat your information confidentially.
2. We understand your family and loved ones will come first.
3. We recognise it's your decision to leave a gift in your Will and you need to decide in your own time.
4. We would love to know if you have left a gift in your Will to WorldShare – but we understand if you would prefer not to tell us.
5. If you do choose to tell us, we will give you the choice about how you would like your gift acknowledged and how we talk to you in the future about our work.
6. We will give you and your family as much choice as we can about how your gift will be used to help future generations of people in need.
7. We will use your gift carefully and cost effectively so that it has the greatest impact for the outcast and forgotten around the world.
8. We will give you the opportunity to be connected with our work that is made possible by gifts like yours.
9. At any time, you have the absolute right to change your mind about a gift in your Will to WorldShare.
10. We will honour your legacy gift with care, sensitivity and respect.
