Our local Ministry partners

Across the world there are millions of people in desperate need of social, physical and spiritual transformation.



WorldShare partners with local Christian organisations who are working in the neediest parts of the world, in places where there is no safety net for the outcast and forgotten. Marginalisation can be due to many factors, including disability and medical needs, age, sexual abuse, ethnic background or marital status. For these people, marginalisation doesn't just mean living on the fringes – it can mean no medical care, no chance of education, no protection from abuse and exploitation... and no hope.

During his time on earth, our Lord Jesus Christ sought out the outcast and forgotten – and he loved them. We believe every person is made in the image of God & has the right to respect and dignity, and to experience the love of God.

Currently, WorldShare has 6 direct partnerships with local Christian organisations in 4 countries throughout East Africa and Asia.



Causes

We believe that loving like Jesus means transforming the lives of the outcast, forgotten and marginalised.

Hearing Impairment

According to the World Health Organisation, 360 million people, 10% of them children, suffer from hearing loss so disabling that activities most people take for granted are a daily struggle.

Hearing-impaired children are unlikely to attend school. Those who do attend school, struggle to hear their teachers which creates a barrier to proper education and opportunities to find work as adults. People who suffer from hearing loss are also at increased risk of physical, social, emotional and sexual abuse. They are often shunned by their families and communities, becoming isolated.

With our Ministry Partners, we are working to provide a safe haven for people with hearing loss, facilitate access to education and teach vocational skills to enable these marginalised groups to enjoy a safe and secure future.





Displacement and Ethnic Exclusion

The number of people forcibly displaced as a result of persecution, conflict, and human rights violations stands at an unprecedented 65.3 million globally. Whilst the causes of displacement and ethnic exclusion vary from country to country, they are characterised by repression and an inability of marginalised ethnic groups to participate fully in the normal relationships and activities, available to the majority of people in a society.

From the Democratic Republic of Congo to the Philippines, WorldShare works to provide spiritual care, security, education, health and economic livelihoods to these marginalised communities.



Abuse and Neglect of Girls & Women

Women make up approximately 70 percent of the world's poor. Two-thirds of people unable to read and write are female. More than 11.4 million girls and women are in forced labour. One in three girls and women experience physical and sexual violence.

Approximately 15 million girls marry before the age of 18 each year – the equivalent of one every 2 seconds. This tragic reality creates a bleak outlook for girls and women, who continue to need support to overcome multiple barriers to their safety and well-being.

Together with our ministry partners, we not only work to provide education and healthcare for women and girls but also provide important livelihood opportunities that enable them to generate income. When women earn money, they invest it in the health and education of their children and families, helping to end the cycle of poverty.

Exploitation

More than 200 million children today are trapped in child labour, with an estimated 120 million of these engaged in hazardous work. Many parents in impoverished countries push their children into work out of necessity, unable to sustain their families on their own incomes. Poverty perpetuates the practice of child labour, depriving children of an education and leaving them without the skills needed to secure a future of themselves and their communities.

We believe every child deserves the opportunity to have a childhood. With our partners, we work to support access to education and healthcare, protection from harm and abuse and to provide vocational skills that mean children and their parents can have alternative livelihoods that are free from exploitation.

Severe Medical Needs

The most vulnerable patients requiring medical help are often unable to afford the cost due to poverty, and other associated factors. Often they have to make harsh choices – knowingly putting their health at risk because they cannot see their children go hungry. In the worst cases, the burden of illness may mean that families sell their property, take children out of school to earn a living or even start begging, perpetuating a vicious cycle that leaves their medical needs unmet.

WorldShare supports programs that respond to the health needs of the poor and marginalised. Better health is not only central to human happiness and well-being, it also makes an important contribution to community development.



Orphans and Vulnerable Children

The HIV/AIDS pandemic, famines, natural disasters, chronic poverty, ongoing conflicts, and civil wars have jeopardised the health, safety and survival of children globally, with more than 143 million estimated to be orphans. An additional number of children are highly vulnerable due to factors such as disability. These vulnerable children face numerous risks, including exploitation, stigma and poor health and educational outcomes.

At WorldShare we support child-centred, family-focused, community-based programs that help extended families and local communities to meet the basic needs of orphans and vulnerable children by providing food, health care, including treatment of children living with HIV/AIDS, education expenses, and clothing.



Spreading the Gospel

"And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." – Colossians 3:17

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus declares that he came to proclaim good news to the poor, liberty to the oppressed and wholeness to the disabled. In light of this, we believe that all of our work – partnering with our supporters and Ministry Partners to love like Jesus and restore hope and life to the outcast and forgotten – is spreading the Gospel of Christ.

All of our Ministry Partners are Christ-centred organisations looking to share the love of Jesus. Whether that is by building a world-class hospital for those in greatest need or by running church services next door where the Gospel is preached.

We also work with our partners on explicitly evangelical programs. These provide training and funding for ministers, chaplains and church planters, so they can be better equipped to share both the love and message of Jesus Christ.



We do this by partnering with international, locally run, Christ-centred organisations who are working within their communities to bring transformation. We call these organisations our Ministry Partners. Through these partnerships we provide:

Spiritual Encouragement

All of our Ministry Partners are Christ-centred and look to God first to guide their work. So it is essential that we support them in prayer, encourage them in their spiritual growth and hold them accountable to their Christian mission.

Connection

By connecting our supporters here in Australia with our Ministry Partners overseas we encourage each other to love like Jesus and empower one another to transform lives and restore hope and life together.

We also deepen our supporters' connection with our Ministry Partners through letters, reports from the field, photos, Ministry Partner visits and short-term trips, all of which reveal the massive impact their support is making in the lives of the outcast, forgotten and marginalised.

Capacity Building and Training

We provide technical assistance, specialised training, mentoring and guidance to our Ministry Partners, to increase their efficiency and effectiveness, strengthen their ability to serve their people and empower them to increase the impact they are having on their communities.

Financial Support

We raise much needed funds to enable our Ministry Partners to run their programs. We rely on God's providence and the generosity of Australians to help empower the most marginalised communities.

Accountability/Transparency

As a Christian organisation we are committed to good stewardship of the resources that have been entrusted to us and are conscious of our responsibility to ensure our work has a positive impact on the marginalised communities we support. In all our work, we aim to demonstrate Christian love, honesty and transparency.





For over 70 years, we have worked in the most challenging regions by resourcing, enabling and encouraging our Ministry Partners to bring ongoing spiritual, physical and social transformation to their own people. We take seriously our responsibility to ensure donations are used for their intended purpose and that the projects we support have a positive impact on their beneficiaries. Regular program monitoring and evaluation form part of our commitment to due diligence. We're transparent with our finances and are audited every year to ensure our financial processes are robust, accurate and consistent.

We provide techinical assistance, specialised training and monitoring and guidance to our Ministry Partners, to strengthen their ability to serve their people and to support them to continually monitor and evaluate each project to determine it's impact and effectiveness. This involves reporting on a financial and project basis, regularly visiting project sites, annually conducting field office and partner audits, and conducting formal evaluations of the project.





How our resources are used





Pastor Rolando and Aida Olivar are PMF Pastors among the squatter families of General Mariano Alvarez (GMA). They earn only \$100 a month (almost as little as the squatter families they pastor to).

So, when a PMF Village Savings and Loan Association (VLSA) started in Cavite in March 2018, they joined in order to build up savings, take a loan if needed, and to encourage families nearby to join as well. Little did they know how this decision would go on to impact their lives within the year.

The early stages of a VSLA program involve teaching members how to budget and build up savings, both individually and as a community. A percentage of the community savings are also put aside as a grant for emergencies, in most cases for a member's illness or death.

For many months Aida had been suffering from a goitre but as she couldn't afford treatment she hadn't gone to hospital. Fortunately their VSLA was able to offer them funds from their emergency grant. When combined with some assistance from their church, this meant Aida could afford to undergo the surgery and the operation was a great success.

In PMF's first year of establishing VSLAs they already have 10 up and running, helping many of Manilla's neediest build savings, get loans, start businesses and develop a sense of community like that experienced by the Olivars.
